

→ HODEIDAH

COMMENT | A Saudi-flagged tanker in transit from Ain Sukhna to Ras Tanura has been approached whilst under naval escort due west of Hodeidah, Yemen. A single boat closed towards the vessel's port beam at 15 knots, prompting a naval vessel to fire a series of warning shots. As the unidentified boat continued its approach, the tanker was instructed to increase speed and alter course, before continuing southbound through the Bab el-Mandeb.

The tanker in question was not displaying AIS as it passed Hodeidah and no other vessel has since reported similar concerns in the immediate area. It may therefore be a simple case of interaction with local maritime traffic. However, the proximity of the approach to a host of attacks against Saudi-aligned interests and the decisive response from the escorting naval vessel would indicate those involved had malign interests. Also in the convoy was another Saudi-flagged tanker that earlier this year suffered a suspected missile strike in the immediate vicinity. It is therefore probable that this approach was not benign, but was ultimately unsuccessful.

COMMENT | There have been two incidents across Southeast Asia this week. The first took place off Tambisan Island, Sabah. The IMB has reported that several people in speed boats approached Malaysia-flagged tug EVER ALPHA whilst underway. Due to the hardening of the tug the criminal syndicate were unable to enter the accommodation and escaped when they noticed a security boat approaching.

The second incident this week took place 3nm off Sagar Island, India. The IMO has reported that a group of at least ten people in a single boat came alongside Liberia-flagged cargo ship STARGATE before two in the group then boarded and stole ship stores. This is the first incident in the Hooghly River for over six months, after the Marshall Islands-flagged bulk carrier TEAM CHALLENGE suffered a similar fate in February.
